Dear Cortlandt Residents,

Over the years we have completed many recreation projects with more to come in 2021: 1. Softball fields with lights at Sprout Brook Park.

- 2. An outdoor pavilion at Sprout Brook Park that has a capacity of 200 people.
- 3. A playground at Sprout Brook Park which is open year round.
- 4. Expansion of our Muriel H. Morabito Community Center which is off West Brook Drive.
- 5. A playground at the Community Center which is handicapped accessible.
- 6. The Christopher Bisordi Memorial Outdoor Basketball Court at the Community Center.
 - 7. Outdoor Bocce Courts and a Horseshoe Facility at the Community Center.
 - Renovation of Charles Cook Pool including a new concrete surface, drainage system, filtration system, bathhouse upgrades, a new play-ground and "frog slide", landscaping and other amenities. (A 2 million dollar project) and renovation of the swimming lanes was completed in 2006.
- 9. The Steven Hebert Memorial Skate Park at the Community Center which is off of West Brook Drive.
- A Roller Hockey Rink adjacent to the New York State Police Headquarters. (Off Route 9A) with lights and a playground.
- 11. Completion of the Historic Tollhouse for a regional information tourist center. Open on weekends May through October.
- 12. Community space use (4,000 sq. ft.) at the Cortlandt Town Center is available for rental (Contact our Recreation Department).
- 13. Steamboat Dock River Park and Overlook in Verplanck are restored and with construction of an outdoor pavilion and a pedestrian trail. We also have plans for the next phases of Broadway Streetscape and new plans for Meahagh Park.
- 14. The Hudson Highlands Gateway Park (Hill point property) is designed for passive recreation (Trails) off Sprout Brook Road. (352 acres of passive land).
- 15. Many beautification projects throughout the town. (Flowerbeds, gazebos, plantings and our Veterans Parks)
- 16. C.U.E. (Cortlandt Upper Teens Entertainment Center) open for all freshman, sophomores, juniors and seniors on Friday and Saturday nights and is supervised by qualified adults.
- 17. Completed the Oscawana Boat/ Kayak Launch.
- 18. A playground, tennis courts and basketball court was built off of Croton Avenue.
- 19. A little league field and a soccer/all-purpose field both at Sprout Brook Park opened in 2008.
- 20. Construction of a Cortlandt Dog ("Pooch") Park at Sprout Brook Park. Grand Opening took place on November 2, 2008.
- 21. A Computer Center at the Senior Citizen Center.
- 22. Renovation of the Town Hall Courtyard and entranceway (New lights, benches, bricks, doors, flowers, new steps etc.)
- 23. A playground at the Roller Hockey Rink off Memorial Drive in memory of Peter Cutignola.
- 24. An annual Cortlandt event "Cortlandt Family Fun Day" (Off Route 9A by the State Police and Roller Hockey Rink).
- 25. Renovation of the swimming lanes at Cook Pool.
- 26. Annual Golf Outing to benefit our first responders at the Hollow Brook Golf Course each year.
- 27. A youth and recreation multi-purpose facility opened in 2009 for ages 11 to 18. It is fully supervised.
- 28. Cortlandt sponsors the D.A.R.E. programs and the Cortlandt Coalition to educate our youth about substance abuse and awareness prevention.
- 29. Quadricentennial projects were completed in 2009 to honor Henry Hudson's discovery of the Hudson River including a time capsule at Town Hall.
- 30. Saved Furnace Dock Lake and the watershed area. It is now owned by the TOC for passive parkland.
- 31. At the former Martin Property now owned by the Town: a boat launch for the community, an aviation theme playground, benches by the Hudson River.
- 32. A Veteran's Park at Steamboat Dock dedicated July 20, 2012.
- 33. Completed a new half-court basketball court in northern Cortlandt June 2012.
- 34. The public boat launch at Cortlandt Waterfront Park was dedicated in the sprin of 2013.
- 35. Annual 5K Run in October.
- 36. A Purple Heart Memorial dedicated at Cortlandt Town Hall.
- 37. Support of the Cortlandt Community Rowing Association (Go to website for more information).
- 38. Free outdoor Concert and Movie Series at Cortlandt Waterfront Park in Verplanck for the summer season.
- 39. Our Community Garden at Meahagh Park.
- 40. Opened our new water spray park in 2016.
- 41. Dedicated a new lacrosse field/all-purpose field at Sprout Park.
- 42. Dedicated new hiking trails at golf course in 2016.
- 43. Will plan for more fields at land purchased from Con Ed in June 2016.
- 44. Dedicated a Vietnam Memorial at Town Hall.
- 45. Mini golf course at the Town pool in 2019.
- 46. Dedicated a new Fitness Trail at Charles J. Cook Pool Park in 2018.
- 47. Established a new Historical Advisory Council, June 2018.
- 48. A new bathhouse at the Charles J. Cook Pool in 2021.
- 49. Working on a town trail system by the river.
- 50. A new snack bar at Charles J. Cook Pool in 2021
- 51. A new basketball court at Charles J. Cook Park in 2021.

All have been completed without raising Town taxes (on average for 30 years)

CORTLANDT SUPERVISOR LINDA PUGLISI TO RETIRE 12/31/21 AFTER 30 YEARS AS SUPERVISOR

In November 2020, I announced my retirement for the end of this two year term effective December 31, 2021. It is with a heavy heart and sadness that I make this announcement since I love Cortlandt and all its wonderful people very much. It has been an honor to be Cortlandt's Supervisor for all of these years. I will have served this great town for thirty years as Town Supervisor and prior to that four years as a Town Councilwoman. Therefore, for thirty four years I have had the privilege of serving this great community.

I have always taken the trust that people have given to me when they elected me to be the leader of Cortlandt seriously, humbly and with great pride. Every single day I always said to myself how can I make Cortlandt even better than it already is and how can I reach out to every neighborhood, organization, group and individual to make their lives better. That has always been my goal.

I raised my two children (twins) Ali and Jeff in Cortlandt. They have gone on to lead very successful lives and are truly kind and giving people. They are my pride and joy and my legacy. They have their roots in Cortlandt and have so many fond memories of growing up in this excellent community that gave them lasting friendships, a good education and values that stay with them today. My daughter and her husband (Tom) have two boys, my grandsons (Oliver and Jeremy). They are amazing and are the light of my life.

I am very proud of all the achievements and accomplishments I have worked on over these three and a half decades including: our Advanced Life Support (ALS/Paramedics) programs and for bringing in the 911 system to Cortlandt. Also, I was the original supporter and negotiated with Lakeland School District to purchase their then closed elementary school for our Town Hall. I've been the first elected Supervisor in our lovely Town Hall. I also negotiated with Metro North to build the Cortlandt Train Station (in two phases). I promised 30 years ago to keep town taxes very low and have delivered on average for 30 years only increasing town taxes by 1% for this entire period at the same time having very low debt, a completion of over ^{\$}160 million in capital projects (infrastructure, paving, water tanks, etc.) and will be leaving a strong fund balance (savings account) of close to ^{\$}20 million dollars, four times of what was in this fund when I started.

I've been so proud to work with our Veterans on their many important issues, to put up many memorials and to hold many wonderful Veteran ceremonies throughout the years. These men and women are heroes. I have worked hard over the 30 years to monitor the safety of Indian Point, to co-chair important closure task forces and now to be part of the overview of the soon to be decommissioning project. Also, I have always been there for our residents throughout the major storms, power outages, the pandemic still ongoing and of course the tragic day of 9/11/2001. Our Youth, Senior and Recreation programs are the best anywhere and I'm so proud of my initiatives to expand upon them over these years; Cortlandt Waterfront Park located on the Hudson River, Community Center expansion, water spray park, mini golf, new tennis courts, a new bathhouse and snack bar and playground all at our town pool campus; lacrosse, softball, soccer and little league fields, many other playgrounds, roller hockey rinks and of course our Youth Center was constructed during my administration to name just a few. I've worked on economic planning along with our economic advisor and Town Board.

I have been able to increase our open space for trails and parkland by 100%, saved and preserved lakes, ponds and streams, passed many strong environmental laws (wetlands, tree, aquifers and steep slopes, etc.) to which we never had before and balanced all of this with rational economic growth (Cortlandt Town Center, Cortlandt Crossing, many smaller businesses have opened during these years) and our hospital has expanded and is now owned by the NY Presbyterian Hospital system. Many new jobs have come into Cortlandt over the years and more to come.

I feel proud that the majority of our employees (200) reside in Cortlandt and that all of our summer youth jobs are Cortlandt residents, as well. Also, along with our team I have completed three Master Plans.

The following events have been my ideas and initiatives implemented by our Recreation and Conservation Department, DES – Parks Division and my staff and supported by our Town Board: Cortlandt Family Fun Day, 5K Run, Winter Wonderland, Egg Hunt in the Spring, Dog Park and Dog Parade at Halloween, outdoor concert and movie series at our Waterfront Park and I have supported all of our senior and youth center events each year. There are too many to list but I'm so very proud of these achievements. I have enjoyed working with all of our excellent employees over the years and serving with many town board members who have made contributions, as well.

Also, I've enjoyed working with everyone in our two Villages (Buchanan and Croton-on-Hudson). I especially love attending activities for our Youth and Scouts.

I pledge to work with the next leaders (Supervisor and Town Board members) elected next November and to make it a very smooth transition in order to achieve my original goal to do what's right for this very special town and for the many residents and families who call CORTLANDT HOME.

Thank you so very much. I love you all and I love Cortlandt!

CORTLANDT TOWN HALL 29TH ANNIVERSARY AND ITS HISTORY

- "Our Town Hall was a former Lakeland School District Elementary School which was put up for sale by the district in 1989.
- The Town of Cortlandt government after a successful public referendum vote in 1991 purchased the school for Town Hall office purposes. The cost was \$1.1 million dollars and was paid in full without bonding from a special fund established for a town hall purpose.
- In my first year as Supervisor, early in 1992, a \$500,000, 5-year note was voted on by the then Town Board to complete necessary improvements before the majority of Town offices could move into our new town hall. This note is now completely paid and therefore no debt is left on our town hall.
- Additional renovations over the years have either been paid for by state grants or from annual budget funds. Once again, no debt.
- The Cortlandt Town Hall is located off Oregon Road on Heady Street and sits on six acres. The main building is 30,000sq. ft. and has offices for the Supervisor, Town Clerk, Receiver of Taxes, Human Resources, Assessor, Town Attorney, Engineering, Planning, Comptroller, Code Enforcement, Recreation; as well as, the Town Court and County Police offices. The smaller building is for Purchasing, Central Supplies and the Department of Technology.
- About half of the Town employees (100) work at this location and the others work out of the Departmentof Environmental Services (D.E.S.) operations buildings/garages and the Community Center, Youth Center and Nor-West.
- After a one-year renovation period of this former school to make it suitable for town government offices, the move took three days in early December of 1992.
- Vincent Nyberg who was the Town's longtime Code Enforcement Director also was a licensed architect and engineer (P.E.). Therefore, he was the perfect choice to be appointed the project manager of our New Town Hall renovation project. Vinny did a wonderful job with input from the Supervisor and Town Board, all of the departments and a citizen committee which helped to select color schemes, furnishings, etc. Our general meeting room is named in his memory.
- I had the honor of being on the original negotiating team, as a town council member, with the Lakeland School District and the Town administration. The negotiations began in 1989 and resulted in the Cortlandt community having a beautiful Town Hall to be proud of, to have a central government office building and to add to Cortlandt's identity.
- The Town Hall is also historic. The first wing was a WPA project in the 1930's. The original brickwork was preserved. The second wing was constructed in 1957 and the third in 1974.
- Our Town Hall dedication ceremony took place on a Sunday afternoon on December 5, 1992. There had been a snowstorm the day before but we went forward with the ceremony the next day and had a packed house of about 300 people. It was a very festive and special day for Cortlandt.
- I have been privileged to serve as the Town Supervisor who had my first offices in the Croton Municipal Building and being the first Supervisor in our new Town Hall having been sworn in as Town Supervisor on January 1, 1992. I always knew that this former elementary school recycled into a town hall would serve our community well and it has done just that for twenty-nine years.

In closing, one of the best parts of my position as Supervisor is to greet young students and scout groups touring our Town Hall and to talk to them about the importance of local government in our lives. I always say to them, I hope you will consider public service in your future and perhaps become a Town Supervisor in our lovely Town Hall. Thank you!"

"I AM VERY PROUD OF HAVING BEEN ABLE TO PROTECT AND PRESERVE THE FOLLOWING OVER THE PAST 30 YEARS DURING THIS ADMINISTRATION:"

- Rezoned the outdated Emery Mine property (in the 1990's) to residential on Colabough Pond Road only seven (7) homes can be built in the future on these 110 acres. To date no construction has taken place. Still privately owned but no mining allowed.
- 2. Rezoned the Emery Mine off Croton Ave to residential; 61 homes were built instead of mining on these 100 acres. (in the late 1990's)
- 3. Voted to not allow a proposal for 300 town houses off Oregon Road (too dense). Now currently 14 single family homes instead- called "Blue Jay Estates" (in the 1990's).
- 4. There was a proposal for a cluster of 360 single family homes on the property then called "Hillpoint". The property is a steep incline and never could have sustained that density of building. After two years of negotiating with the property owner the Town with several partners including N.Y.S, Scenic Hudson, Westchester County, and some residents purchased these 360 acres, which is now dedicated parkland for hiking to a beautiful summit. It's now called the "Gateway to the Hudson Highlands" in Cortlandt, (the collective cost was \$6 million. The Town contributed \$1 million)
- 5. The "Jessye Norman Property" off Mt. Airy Road previously owned by the late opera star Jessye Norman is a very sensitive and important ecological property in our community. The town in 2015 purchased the majority of these thirty (30) acres to preserve the land. Only three homes can still be built on the remaining property. The rest is preserved.
- 6. Saved Furnace Dock Lake off Furnace Dock Road by purchasing the lake and watershed area from Con Edison. One third of the pur-chase price of the \$300,000 came from the adjoining property owner/developer of a proposed townhouse plan. Saving this lake was critical to preserve the wildlife and biodiversity of the area.
- 7. "Abey Rose" property off Maple Ave / Furnace Dock Road the town recently acquired approximately 129 acres from the property owner to protect the integrity of this land and area. The property cannot be built upon and is preserved.
- 8. Reduced the "Habitat Lafayette" development from 300 to 117 homes in the early 1990's. It is now called "Cortlandt Estates" and this took several years to reduce the proposed over-development.
- 9. Fifty (50) Acres off Sniffen Mountain Road/Furnace Dock Road were preserved when we asked the Valeria developer to donate this very sensitive land to the Town of Cortlandt instead of building ten (10) single family homes. They agreed and now the town has added this very special parcel to its areas of hiking trails/open space.
- 10. Hamlet of Verplanck/Town of Cortlandt:
 - Purchased the former Newman property on the Hudson River for \$600,000, in the 1990's, reclaimed the land for several years using Brownsfield grant funding and now it's our Cortlandt Waterfront Park after there was discovered an underground oil leak.
 - The former Martin trailer parkland was deeded to the town in a negotiated life estate agreement in the early 1990's. After Mr. Jim Martin passed away and after allowing the mobile homes to remain for an additional ten years, the entire property is now a town park, contiguous with the Cortlandt Waterfront Park.
 - Steamboat Dock and the Overlook also an extension of this town's lovely park area was preserved with a lovely gazebo and for an area for fishing and reflection of the river.
 - We purchased 99 acres from Con Edison off Broadway, which abuts the Hudson River for recreational and/or municipal purposes.
 - We turned town property near our Lake Meahagh into a lovely park, recreational site and added a community garden.
- 11. Oscawana Island a beautiful property near the Hudson River is leased to the Town of Cortlandt by Westchester County into the future.
- 12. We protected wetlands, aquifers, watershed, lakes and trees with legislation and ordinances for the present and for our future.
- 13. A total of 3,000 additional acres has been added to our Open Space inventory and has been used for recreational purposes and/or for protection of the environment. This has been balanced with Economic Growth in the appropriate areas of Town.

ECONOMIC GROWTH OVER MY 30 YEARS AS CORTLANDT'S TOWN SUPERVISOR

"I'd like to feature our town's economic growth which is equally important in any level of government but, especially at a local level. I have always felt that balancing the open space with economic growth is critical in the evolution of a community for many reasons: Businesses, current and new, small and large employ many residents and provide full-time and part-time jobs. Also, businesses bring in tax revenue to our town's treasury and help to offset tax increases for residential property owners. Businesses provide interesting shopping experiences, dining, grocery stores, delis, catering venues, professional services and, of course, commercial or industrial.

Cortlandt has approximately 200 small businesses. I have attended many ribbon cuttings over the years giving out proclamations and have welcomed in new businesses to be part of our business family (hair salons, restaurants, medical offices, insurance businesses, realtor's offices and many more).

Our largest taxpayer and employer of course was always Indian Point and the two operating nuclear plants currently owned by Entergy, Inc. It is located in the Village of Buchanan and in the Town of Cortlandt, as well. These plants will be permanently closed this April and will be dismantled /decommissioned by a new company for 20 to 60 years. Only about one third of the 900 jobs will remain and significantly reduced revenue will result.

Due to this closure and the challenges it brings, the Town is seeking new businesses with an economic consultant to help offset the loss of revenue. We work closely with the Village of Buchanan, the Hendrick Hudson School District which will also be affected and with residents on our local task forces.

During the thirty years there was a large expansion of our major shopping mall called the Cortlandt Town Center (for identity) off Rte. 6, which we call the Cortlandt Boulevard (also for identity). It doubled in size, brought in additional tax revenue, many new jobs and exciting new stores, restaurants and a movie theater (still opened today). This took place in the late 1990's. More recently, across from this Center a smaller but lovely shopping mall opened named "Cortlandt Crossing" with a clock tower that I insisted on for aesthetic purposes. This produced once again more jobs and revenue and a different variety of shopping for our residents.

Some stores recently closed in these malls nationally or regionally but I am in constant communication with the mall owners

and they tell me new stores/restaurants will replace them very soon. We have worked with our local contractors, builders, developers to build new housing areas (apartments, affordable units, condos, townhouses and subdivisions) which adds to our growth, as well. I was instrumental in lobbying Metro North for a state of the art new Cortlandt train station (identity, once again), which opened in 2000 where many of our residents and business owners can commute if need be to New York City. The fact that we are only one hour from Manhattan is important to a company or a business looking to locate in Cortlandt. Along with our economic consultant, board members and staff we have many exciting possibilities for our future ecnomic growth.

The town has a new brand which is a trademark called "Where Life works". We believe this logo/brand tells our successful story in Cortlandt.

Each Spring we host a month long emphasis on a "SHOP/DINE/DO BUSINESS" event to showcase our many businesses. Incentives from the small businesses are given out to our residents their consumers. It is a lot of fun! However, I always say every day of the year everyone should SHOP/DINE/DO BUSINESS in our wonderful community.

We also have an expanded hospital center in Cortlandt recently purchased by New York Presbyterian Hospital of NYC bringing in addi-tional medical services and jobs of all kinds to our community. We've also seen expanded nursing homes and soon will have a Senior Living Complex in town. All add to our overall economic and service oriented story.

In conclusion, I am very proud of our economic growth during my thirty years as Town Supervisor. We have a vibrant and healthy economy and we have also assisted our smaller businesses navigate the Pandemic by giving them infor-mation and guidance."



"Another very important part of a local government is its Recreation activities, sports programs, projects and special events for all age groups. I am very proud of all of the new amenities, recreation areas, programs and events we have initiated and developed over my thirty years as Cortlandt's Town Supervisor.

Here is a list of some of these enjoyed by all: A new Youth Center, an expanded Senior Center, many new playgrounds (one is handicapped accessible), softball fields with lights, a lacrosse field and a soccer field, a very popular dog park, and outdoor pavilions for gatherings and picnics.

In addition, an outdoor roller hockey rink and a skate park are enjoyed by our youth, as well as, new bas-ketball courts, tennis courts and a public boat launch on the Hudson River and a wonderful fitness trail and many other trails have been part of our achievements over the years.

We have purchased open space areas over the years that have allowed us to expand our programs and to hold special events. For example, an annual "Cortlandt Family Fun Day" with fireworks, many Halloween events, an Egg Hunt in the Spring, a 5K run and a "Winter Wonderland" in December each year.

Summer outdoor concerts and movies are held on town property by the Hudson River free of charge to our residents. Our seniors and our Veterans hold many wonderful ceremonies and events at our many park areas. Little Leagues and other youth leagues use our fields, as well. We host a community garden and this year will construct pickleball courts, which are very popular.

We are very proud of our Charles Cook Pool and campus. This property was an acquisition by the late Town Supervisor – Charles Cook – administration decades ago.

At this recreational site, we have an expanded swimming pool and swimming lanes, a water spray park with many features, new tennis courts and a basketball court, as well as, a 9-hole miniature golf course at no charge to our residents.

Summer camps enjoy this lovely area and this year we will dedicate a brand new State of the Art bathhouse and snack bar. All completed in my administration of 30 years. I thank the current and past town boards for their support.

Our fitness trail is on this campus as is Nor-West, which provides excellent services for individuals of all ages who are challenged and have special needs. I am especially proud of this important program.

We also have a very successful Rowing Association (crew) started by Councilman Frank Farrell.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND CAPITAL PROJECTS

"A big part of being a Town Supervisor is planning to repair, improve and construct new infrastructures throughout the Community.

For example: water storage tanks, traffic signals, replacement of waterlines, drainage projects, road improvements including paving a number of roads each year (the Town of Cortlandt averages \$2 million dollars each year).

Also, we seek grants to assist us with traffic calming measures, new sidewalks, improved traffic signal areas, roundabouts, sewers, etc.

The Town during my administration passed a local law to annually adopt a C.I.P., a Capital Improvement Plan. A staff committee and I put together this five year plan each year and list of needed projects each over \$50,000 for the Town Board to consider and to vote on. It totals millions of dollars each year and some of these projects are phased over a couple of years.

It is a very good way to plan for necessary infrastructure and capital projects to address the needs of a community. This C.I.P. can range from large vehicles such as snowplows (250K) to playgrounds, ball fields, water tanks, paving, expansion of our Senior Community Center, a new bathhouse/snack bar (done this year at our town pool) and many more.

This C.I.P. also helps me as Supervisor and our Comptroller to budget for these expenses each year. A percentage of the costs of these large projects come either from our town's fund balance or bonding and are also offset from grants at the State or Federal level.


Sharing services with other municipalities is another way to help pay for these major projects especially for unfunded mandates. For example, when we received a mandate from the EPA/Federal Government to filter our town's water in the 1990's we formed a Northern Westchester Joint Waterworks with two other towns and a smaller water district to share in the costs of building a new filtration plant. This waterworks continues to this day. I serve on the executive board. The Town of Cortlandt saved \$8 mil-lion by sharing in this cost with our partners.

One of my first major projects I worked on also in the 1990's was to lobby Metro North/MTA to build a new larger train station in Cortlandt and they did (The Cortlandt Train Station). It's in the central part of our town and services many of our commuters and those wanting to take an occasional trip into the City.

So, I'm very proud of all of these major improvements and of the new funding plans we developed to benefit our community."

VETERANS AND SENIOR CITIZENS

"Two other groups in our community that have always been very important to me are the Veterans (men and women) and our Senior Citizens. Both groups deserve and have earned our deep respect and gratitude for everything they have contributed to our Country and to our community.

My late father, coming out of college enlisted in the Marines at a very young age. He was eventually sent over to guard what was left of Pearl Harbor after the attacks during WWII. I'm sure those years stayed with him his whole life. He often told me if I ever have an opportunity to give back and assist Veterans to please try my best. I have tried to live up to my father's request as Supervisor.

First, myself and the late Michael Mongero, a WWII veteran who actually landed on Normandy Beach when he was only 17 years old and survived, started our first Cortlandt Veteran's Committee, which has grown to become regional back in 1992 my first year as Supervisor. Mike was also a Cortlandt Town Councilman in the 1980's and a great person! After Mike's passing away, Fremont Reif became our Chairman and currently, it is headed by Willy Nazario, a Purple Heart Vietnam Veteran and another dedicated leader for our Veterans.

We have held monthly meetings ever since this committee was formed and had speakers on many important issues for our Veterans. We also hold very special Veteran ceremonies for Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Pearl Harbor Day and for all other occasions. I have felt privileged to be the Master of Ceremonies at these events over the years. When I hear "Taps" played I get tears in my eyes.

Our Veteran's Committee along with our Town Board and I have fought to keep the FDR VA Hospital open and to keep and increase services for our Veterans (men and women) who have defended our great Country. I always say, "Our Veterans fought for us and now we need to fight for them".

We were successful in our efforts to keep the VA open, increase services, to have built a new indoor pool for Veterans and to have the only NYS Veterans Nursing Home for spouses, as well, on this campus in the region. We are very proud of this distinction.

Through the years I am proud to say that the Town has built many memorials paying tribute to our Veterans; a Purple Heart memorial, a Vietnam Era memorial, a memorial honoring all branches of the service an enhanced WWII memorial and a memorial honoring all Veterans throughout the years at our Hudson River Waterfront Park. We also have a Veteran's banner tribute along two of our major corridors.

I consider all of our Veterans and their families dear friends and cherish the memories of those who have passed away. They are all proud of their service and we are proud of them.

We also have many senior citizen clubs, programs, activities and events for our Seniors. Our community center is used solely by our seniors during the week supervised by an excellent staff: A Director, Assistant Director, a nutrition and kitchen staff and others who join the seniors for informational programs.

Our Center is named after Supervisor Muriel H. Morabito, the first woman Town Supervisor (in the early 1970's). There have only been two women supervisors. I am the only other woman Supervisor in the 233-year history of Cortlandt.

The Senior Clubs go on approximately twelve interesting trips during the year and have special luncheons and events/ parties that I have loved attending during

my thirty years as Town Supervisor.

Hundreds of our Seniors attend our clubs and programs. During the pandemic the center was closed due to Covid-19, but our staff made a point of making calls a few times during the year to check in on them. The staff was still working at the center and could be reached to assist the Seniors with their questions and needs.

So, in conclusion helping both the Veterans and the Senior Citizens in every local government is a priority and certainly has been for me. Once again, I truly love and respect each Senior and Veteran and always enjoy hearing them talk about their families and lives."

The Village of Buchanan and the Town of Cortlandt have formed a committee (CAP), chaired by the Mayor of Buchanan and Vice Chair, the Town of Cortlandt Supervisor, to monitor all aspects and the safety of these next steps."

A SEPTEMBER 11, 2001 REMEMBRANCE BY SUPERVISOR LINDA D. PUGLISI AND TWENTY YEARS LATER

"This year (2021) marks the 20th anniversary of 9/11. A very sad and tragic day for our Country, region and for our community, as well. September 11, 2001 was a Tuesday and it started out as a bright, sunny day right after Labor Day. People were back from their summer vacations, children were back in school and everyone was back to work preparing for a good and successful year as we embarked on a new decade.

Then suddenly our entire world and our lives changed when we learned early that morning around 9:30am the World Trade Center, the Pentagon had been attacked and a commercial airplane went down in a field in Pennsylvania all by terrorists who wanted to destroy us. Like the Pearl Harbor attack on December 7, 1941, this day will also "live in infamy" to quote President Franklin D. Roosevelt so many years before.

As Supervisor I sent all of our employees home, locked our doors and stayed at Town Hall to receive information and then pass it along to our board and community. I was joined by three other key department heads to assist me that day. I remember contacting the Governor's office (George Pataki), other elected officials at various levels of government and was in communication with Indian Point (nuclear plants) representatives. The plane that struck the World Trade Center actually flew over Indian Point and the Hudson River. We were fearful another attack would occur at these plants. It was a very difficult and sad day.

In Cortlandt, Croton and Buchanan we lost the following wonderful individuals:

William F. Abrahamson, Town of Cortlandt FF George C. Cain, 1st Responder, FDNY PO Stephen P. Driscoll, 1st Responder, NYPD James A. Oakley, Town of Cortlandt Gregory E. Rodriguez, Village of Croton-on-Hudson Thomas E. Sinton III, Town of Cortlandt Randall L. Sprance, 2nd Responder, U.S. Dept. of Treasury Joseph J. Zuccala, Town of Cortlandt FF Michael R. O'Hanlon, 1st Responder, FDNY

We held moment of silence ceremonies and had clergy present to pray with us for those we lost, for their families, for our community and for our nation.

Many of our first responders went down to Ground Zero to assist in the search and rescue effort. They are all Heroes.

Every year since we've held memorial services on 9/11 and this year will be the 20th. I can't believe it's been twenty years. I will never forget and I know you won't, as well.

The second important part of our remembrance is that a 9/11 committee was formed in-cluding Cortlandt with Buchanan and Croton-on-Hudson.

The chair of this committee is a wonderful person, Janet Mainiero, who spearheaded our effort to design, find the right location (Croton Landing) and to have a large bronze statue sculpted (Lauren Davis, the sculptress). The designer/architect is James Rhodes and the name we all selected is "Reaching through the Shadows." It's a woman reaching towards the sky reaching for her lost loved ones on 9/11. It's very beautiful and is adjacent to the Hud son River. One can walk to this area and reflect on that tragic day.

TOWN OF CORTLANDT 2021 GOALS

- Continue our excellent financial record. Moody's upgraded our bond rating to Aa1 in 2020 for our good record. Also, to keep the town tax increases very low. In 2019 the increase was only 0.9% (equals \$15 for the year) and overall for 29 years only on average a 1% town tax increase in total. The 2020/2021 town tax increases are 0%. I'm very proud of this record which includes very low town debt.
- 2. Continue our Military Veterans Banners on Albany Post Rd. along the corridor in front of the V.A. and also along Oregon Rd. in the northern part of Cortlandt. (Contact my office @ 914-734-1002 to learn more or go on our town's website at www.townofcortlandt.com.)
- 3. To oversee and monitor the closure and decommissioning of the two operating Nuclear Plants at Indian Point (located in the Village of Buchanan and Town of Cortlandt). We work closely with the Buchanan Mayor and officials, as well as, the Hendrick Hudson School District both of which will be fiscally impacted by the loss of revenue when the plants close in 2021.
- 4. The town's new bathhouse will be completed this year and snack bar in 2021 for the season at our town pool location. Also, new golf carts and half court basketball courts
- 5. Continue our economic growth in the right locations in the town to offset our upcoming loss of revenue from Indian Point (\$800,000 a year, 2% of our annual revenue) including on town property and in the Hendrick Hudson School District Area to assist them.
- 6. More sewer projects in the town. We received a grant from NYS to offset the costs for the properties along Albany Post Rd. in Montrose and other sewer projects are being developed, as well.
- 7. During the pandemic we had to take a PAUSE for safety purposes but we are looking forward to our "Cortlandt Family Fun Day" and "Winter Wonderland" resuming this year.
- 8. Sustainability issues are very important to us in this administration and we will continue energy programs (i.e. solar projects and HVAC at the Town Hall)
- 9. We have expanded our social media opportunities (i.e. Instagram) and will continue these important efforts for communication.
- 10. We've been successful removing blighted structures and will continue to do so along with the removal of all billboards town wide. They have become outdated due to many other ways to advertise.
- 11. Cortlandt Waterfront Park along the Hudson River in the Verplanck hamlet has become a center of activity for our community (summer concerts etc.). We are completing plans for a Discovery Center at the park this year.
- 12. We will work with the successful Cortlandt Community Rowing Association started by Councilman Frank Farrell to construct a new hangar for storage of the crew boats and in many other ways to promote this important program.
- 13. Many infrastructure projects and our extended paving plan will continue in 2021. We are very pleased that ^{\$}3 million of resurfacing was completed in 2019 and ^{\$}1.5 million in 2020.
- 14. We have many important programs and activities for our Seniors and youth at our centers and many recreational programs. (See our quarterly recreation brochures to learn more.)
- 15. Work with new entrepreneurs wanting to locate in the Town as a result of our new branding campaign, "Where Life Works" kicked off in 2020.
- 16. As always, we support our Veterans and those defending our Country today and will continue our Veteran's committee and our many ceremonies.



2020 TOWN, WESTCHESTER COUNTY, SPECIAL DISTRICTS & SCHOOL DISTRICT







- All material must be natural and plants must be kept under 30" as to not interfere with traffic safety.
- A sign with your name will be provided by the Town of Cortlandt and will be placed on the island. Please give your information to our DES office by emailing fredp@townofcortlandt.com.
- Most of all, the Town asks that you stay safe while working on your island and always use common sense, especially in high traffic areas and always wear bright clothing for safety purposes. Your organization is solely responsible to follow all safety precautions and guidelines while working on your project.

- The Town has the right to terminate the Adopt-an-Island Program at any time and in doing so will remove signage for the island.

AMANDA'S LAW: CARBON MONOXIDE ALARM REQUIREMENTS GO INTO EFFECT FEBRUARY 22, 2010

As a result of recent legislation, Amandas Law went into effect on February 22, 2010. Amanda's Law was named in honor of Buffalo resident Amanda Hansen, a teenage girl who lost her life to carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning from a defective boiler when sleeping over a friend's house in January 2009. It requires essentially all residences, both new and existing, to have carbon monoxide alarms installed. The specific requirements differ for new and existing residences and also on when the buildings were built and subcategories of occupancy groups.

ATTENTION HOME OWNERS

If your home is equipped with an alarm system it must be registered with the Town by obtaining an alarm permit with pertinent information relative to your home. (i.e., animals, contact persons, etc.) These permits are valid for long as you own your home. A new permit must be obtained when ownership changes. The permit information is distributed to the appropriate emergency services to enable them to respond to the alarm more efficiently. Applications can be by mail and can be obtained from the code enforcement office. Call 914-734-1010 for any further information or application.

SOLUTIONS TO STORMWATER POLLUTION

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water



Stormwater is water from rain or melting snow that flows from rooftops, paved areas and lawns that doesn't soak into the ground but runs off into waterways, like streams, ponds, lakes, and rivers.

As it flows, stormwater runoff collects and transports soil, animal waste, salt, fertilizers, oil and grease, pesticides, litter and other potential pollutants. This pollution can enter groundwater, streams, lakes, ponds, and rivers and can even affect the quality of our drinking water.

Increase in impervious surfaces cause more stormwater runoff. Because less water is soaking in, flooding can become more frequent and more destructive.

The Town of Cortlandt is a regulated community and has enacted updated Town ordinances governing stormwater. To learn more, visit our website at: www.townofcortlandt.com/stormwater

What can you do to help with Stormwater Issues?

Lawn Care

Most lawns tested in Westchester County DO NOT need more phosphorus. If you must fertilize, use phosphorus-free fertilizer (where the middle number on the bag is zero). Excess fertilizer flows into streams, lakes, rivers, and reservoirs, where it can degrade drinking water, lead to algae and plant growth and contribute to fish kills. Don't fertilize when rain is expected. Leave grass clippings on the lawn to recycle nutrients. More information on lawn care is available in the Town of Cortlandt Recycling brochure.

Septic System Maintenance

Failing septic systems can contaminate groundwater, drinking water and surface flows. Most of the Town of Cortlandt is serviced by individual septic systems. Your septic system should be pumped and inspected regularly. Generally, septic tanks should be cleaned out every 3-5 years, depending on the size of the tank. Do not pour chemicals, paints, fats, or excess medications down your pipes. Driving on or parking on septic field may damage them.

Scoop the Poop

Please pick up after your dog or cat. It doesn't matter the size of the animal- all animal waste has an impact. Animal waste is easily carried by runoff, washing off roads and lawns. Pet waste contains harmful bacteria and phosphorus that can promote the growth of weeds and algae.

Landscaping Helps

Keep vegetation and organic material on the soil, especially on slopes. Landscape to limit the steepness or length of slopes. Build a buffer of vegetation by watercourses to help filter sediment. Replace the lawn at water's edge with shrubs, hedges or trees. Anything that slows the flow of water will help us give time for the pollution to be removed.

Care for your Car

Little drops of oil and gas add up. One pint of oil can cause an oil slick the size of a football field. Take used motor oil to gas stations. NEVER pour it down the drain. Take other fluids to approved recycling locations. Use saw dust or kitty litter to clean up leaks and spills in your driveway. Wash your car on your lawn if possible to capture runoff.

Reporting Stormwater Polluters

Your actions or the action of your neighbor can affect water resources. We are all downstream of someone. No polluted water should be allowed to go into our stormwater system. If you notice pollution of Stormwater you can report the details to the Town of Cortlandt Stormwater Hotline at Town Code Enforcement at 914-734-1010.

 - Taken within the past 6 months, showing current appearance.
 - Use a clear image of your face. Do not use filters commonly used on social media.
 - Full face, front view with a plain background.
 - Have someone else take your photo. No selfies.
 - Do not wear a hat or headgear.
 - Do not wear sunglasses.
- 3. Office staff will then register each family member for their ID Cards.
- 4. Residents will be notified when their ID Cards are registered through Community Pass. Once they ID Cards are registered in Community Pass, residents must login to their Community Pass accounts and pay their ID Card balance.

Families will not be eligible to register for any other program through the Town of Cortlandt Community Pass Online Registration Software until the balance for their ID Cards is paid in full.

5. Finally, office staff will print the physical ID Cards, and mail them to the address on the residents Community Pass account.

Residents may also get Town of Cortlandt Recreation Photo ID Cards in office. Residents may call the Town of Cortlandt Recreation Department Office at 914-734-1050 and make an appointment. Appointment hours are between 9:00 AM– 3:30 PM, Monday - Friday.

Buchanan and Croton residents may use their Village ID card to receive our ID card rate for all programs except our summer swim passes and summer swim lessons. If you have a Buchanan or Croton Village ID Card and wish to register for a program online, please contact the Town of Cortlandt Recreation Department at recidcard@townofcortlandt.com.

A full refund will be issued for any program cancelled by the Recreation Department.

- Any refund request because of illness or accident must be submitted in writing and be accompanied by a Doctor's Note. - All other refund/credit requests (Other than medical) must also be submitted in writing and will be assessed a
 ^{\$}15.00 processing fee and issued a prorated program credit based on the date received. The credit must be used
 within two years from the date and must be mailed in with your application to ensure proper credit towards your
 next program or league registration. The credit is not replaceable original form must be sub-mitted for credit.
- Whether the initial registration is paid via cash, check, or credit card, all refunds will be issued via check.

SLIDING FEE SCALE AVAILABLE

- Motorized vehicles and mountain bikes
- Fires, smoking, swimming, and dumping

- Feeding wildlife, metal detectors, and radios
- Fireworks, music, and loud noise

HUDSON RIVER COMMUNITY BOAT LAUNCH Located at the Cortlandt Waterfront Park (Off Riverview Avenue and Broadway in the Hamlet of Verplanck) Seasonal Use ONLY from April 1 through October 31 Park Hours 7:00 AM to Dusk Rules and Regulations

- Town of Cortlandt, Village of Buchanan and Village of Croton residents only.
- Use of the ramp for commercial purpose is strictly prohibited.
- Town of Cortlandt Boat Launch Permit is required. Permit is available at the Cortlandt Town Hall in the Town Clerk's office at 1 Heady Street, Cortlandt Manor, New York 10567, the main phone number is 914–734-1020
- Clear Ramp area Come in Slow NO WAKE
- Seasonal use only from April 1 through October 31
- Pull boat around to launching ramp as soon as space becomes available. Pull boat to the tie-down zone and clear the ramp so others may use the boat launch.
- Permit for ramp access MUST be in full view on the dash or mirror of your vehicle. If your permit is not in view, you will receive a summons and fines.
- Anyone driving over 5 MPH within 50 feet of the shore will forfeit their permit and be given a summons and fines.
- Boat size not to exceed 22 feet.
- NO swimming, sunbathing.
- Waterskiing or loitering in the launch area.
- NO overnight parking.



CORTLANDT DOG PARK

Dog Park Rules and Regulations

PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND LIABILTY INSURANCE

- 1. Dog Park closes at dusk daily.
- 2. No animals other than dogs may be brought into the fenced area.
- 3. All dogs must be leashed until safely inside the Dog Park and returned to a gates are closed after entering and leaving the park.
- 4. Do not leave a leash on dogs in the park. Bring your leash into the park in case of emergency or altercation.
- 5. Dog owners must remain in the fenced area while their dogs are using the Dog Park. Owners must be in view of their dogs and have voice control at all times.
- 6. Children accompanying dog owners must be strictly supervised and at least 12 years old to be allowed inside unless accompanied by an adult.
- 7. Children under 10 years old not allowed (some dogs see small dogs as prey) in large dog area.
- 8. Children under 5 years old not allowed in the park.
- 9. Spectators should remain outside the fenced area.
- 10. Aggressive dogs and dogs in heat are not allowed.
- 11. Owners must immediately leash and remove dogs from the Dog Park at the first sight of aggressive behavior.
- 12. Please be courteous to others do not bring sick dogs to the park.
- 13. Owners must dispose of waste properly in the designated on-site containers. Owners must prevent dogs from digging holes.
- 14. While small bite-sized training treats are permitted, foods in bowls, long lasting chews, or glass containers are not allowed.
- 15. No Smoking and no food are allowed inside of the Dog Park.
- 16. No more than three (3) dogs per person are allowed on any single visit.
- 17. Puppies less than four (4) months old are not permitted in the park.
- 18. Dogs must be licensed and vaccinated for rabies and DHLPP. Current license and rabies tags must be worn on the dog's collar at all times.
- Owners are liable for any injury or damage caused by their dog and are fully responsible for their dog's actions.
- 20. Trainers are not allowed to use the park to conduct business.
- 21. Any incident, problem etc. should be reported to Cortlandt Recreation and Parks 914-734-1050. Office is open Monday thru Friday 8:30am to 4pm.
- 22. In the event of an emergency call 911.

I Understand That: Permission from the Town to use the Dog Park is conditional on compliance with the above dog park rules.

I Also Understand and Agree That: The dog park is to provide a fencedin area where dog owners may bring their dogs and permit them to run freely with other dogs, and that unleashing my dog (s) and being present in an area where there are other people, including children, and other unleashed dogs, poses risks to others and myself and to my dog (s) and the dogs and property of dogs, and I do hereby agree to assume such risks.

I Further Agree To: Release, discharge, hold harmless and indemnify the Town all of it's officials, agents, officers, employees and representatives from liability for any and all claims for injuries, damages and/or losses whatsoever to any person or animal (including but not limited to disability and death) or property which may arise out of, result from or be associated with the use of or presence on the dog park by myself and/or my dog (s).

On Tuesday and Thursday, 7 of the tee times are discounted at ^{\$}85 after 2:00 PM, Greens fees will be a total ^{\$}110 for all other tee times Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. On Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays greens fees will be ^{\$}160 with no tee times before noon. Prices include greens fees and a cart. Range balls (only available when playing) for ^{\$}10. Reservations can be made five days in advance by calling 914-734-1500.

For the 2021 golf season residents will need to purchase a golf sticker in the recreation department of Town Hall, 1 Heady Street, Cortlandt Manor, N.Y. for a fee of ^{\$}12 for the 2021 Golf season. HOLLOW BROOK TRAIL

Hollow Brook Trail was dedicated on October 20, 2016 the trail is part of 70 acres that was given to the Town several years ago. The trail was completed in August and is approximately 3 quarters of a mile long. The entrance to the trail is located at the bottom of Anton Place, in Lake Peekskill, Town of Cortlandt. The trail is adjacent to the Hollow Brook golf course.



CHARLES J. COOK PARK MINIATURE GOLF At Charles J. Cook Recreation Center, a 9-hole miniature golf course opened in the spring of 2019. Each hole has a Town of Cortlandt inspired feature such as

the Little Red School House, Bear Mountain Bridge and Toll House. The course will be open to both pool users and the general public during normal operating hours. The golf course will remain open spring, fall, summer weather permitting.




CHARLES J. COOK PARK FITNESS TRAIL The nature and fitness trail is approximately ½ mile and consists of an 8-ft wide rustic trail (natural) and twenty (20) pieces of fitness equipment.



HUDSON HIGHLANDS GATEWAY PARK

Sprout Brook Road (Main), Doris Lee Drive, Cortlandt Manor



Threatened twice by dense residential development, was protected in 1998 when a coalition of more than 35 groups representing homeowners, the homeowners, the community, government agencies and several environmental organizations united to preserve this 352-acre site. The Coalition to Preserve the Hudson Highlands Gateway raised \$6 million to buy the parcel. In May 2000, the Scenic Hudson Land Trust, the Town of Cortlandt and

Westchester County purchased the property.

A network of trails in the park exposes visitors to woodlands, streams, steep slopes, bedrock outcroppings and meadows, revealing much human and natural history and providing spectacular river views. This park is ecologically significant because it is home to several; noteworthy ecosystems. The site's upland wetlands are crucial for many frogs and salamanders to survive. Several different snake species use the prominent, east-facing cliffs of the park to warm themselves in the sun. Also the park's Westchester County location is in one of the country's three major bird migration corridors. Come spring, hundreds of thousands of birds fly over the park where they stop to rest and feed.

Since the property was acquired, the Hudson Highlands Gateway Task Force, a group of concerned citizens - has been working with The Scenic Hudson Land Trust, the Town of Cortlandt and New York-New Jersey Trail Conference on issues including park improvements, illegal ATV use and assessing the park's natural resources.

Hudson Highlands Gateway Park is an ideal destination for an afternoon or all-day outing. Recreational activities abound, including hiking, birding, cross-country skiing, fishing and snowshoeing. Located at the southern end of the fabled Hudson Highlands, the park once served as a Revolutionary War lookout and now is open for public enjoyment.

Directions

Two parking areas are available; one is temporarily shared with Sprout Brook Park, 0.3 miles from the intersection of Sprout Brook Road and Highland Avenue, just past and on the same side as the athletic. Cross road and enter park through the gap in guardrail. Universally accessible parking area is at the end of Doris Lee Drive (see map). Park on gravel in front of fence.

Operating Hours: Open year-round, from dawn to dusk.

- The park is open dawn to dusk.
- Vehicles are permitted only in the designated parking areas.
- Stay within the posted property boundaries, and be considerate of other visitors and adjoining property owners.
- Keep pets leashed; please clean up after them.
- Do not remove or destroy plants, wildlife or artifacts.
- Always hike with a friend.

The following are prohibited:

 Motorized vehicles, camping, fires, alcohol, firearms, feeding wildlife, smoking, dumping, swimming, metal detectors, mountain bikes and radios.

The preserve offers:

Hiking, birding, fishing in Annisville Creek, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing and waterfowl observation.

Caution:

Deer ticks, which can transmit Lyme disease, are a growing problem. Take precautions and check for ticks after leaving.

Description of Trails:

Hudson Highlands Gateway Park has four trails, totaling more than 4.9 miles that traverse the 352-acre site. There are many meandering, wooded roads where one could easily get lost. Please stay on marked trails. The degree of difficulty for the hiking trails ranges from easy to moderate. Trail users should wear sturdy shoes and beware of loose rocks, holes and slippery surfaces.

(Red Trail) Annsville Creek Trail 1 mile, approx. 1 hr.

This trail starts at Doris Lee Drive and is universally accessible to the Pond Overlook. It travels by Annisville Creek, which contains breeding trout populations. Fishing is allowed. A sensitive wetland area surrounds the creek.

(Blue Trail) Upland Trail 2 miles

A steep ascent through a meadow and mixed woods forest brings visitors to a terrific view of the Hudson River. The remainder of the trail encompasses rolling terrain that passes by many historic stonewalls.

(Yellow Trail) Hudson Overlook Spur 0.6 miles

Distinguished by its scenic overlook, this trail also crosses a small stream that is the outlet for a large wetland upslope.

(White Trail) Vernal Pool Trail 1.6 miles

Beginning from the northernmost point of the Upland Trail, this trail works its way up and along a ridgeline. As it descends it passes by a large vernal pool, through a wetland and contains a number of steep slopes. Be cautions of wet surfaces. The trail finishes along an old woods road and rejoins the Upland Trail.



OSCAWANA BOAT LAUNCH

Oscawana boat launch is located on Cortlandt Street in Crugers. A launching area for kayak's and canoes; hiking trails that lead out to the Hudson River. It was dedicated on October 4, 2004 by Cortlandt Town Supervisor and the Town Board.



SPROUT BROOK PARK

Sprout Brook is located at 130 Sprout Brook Road in the Town of Cortlandt. The park is over 22 acres and has two lighted men's and women's softball fields. Within the park there is a little league field as well as a soccer field. Both were dedicated in the spring of 2007. The little league field has a snack bar and a batting cage. A dog park with two separate areas for small and large dogs was dedicated in 2008. There is a large pavilion with barbeque grills for rental by the public that can accommodate up to 200 people. Located by the pavilion there is a playground for children. In the Fall of 2016, a new Lacrosse/ All purpose field was dedicated.



STEVEN HEBERT MEMORIAL SKATE PARK Muriel H. Morabito Community Center West Brook Drive, Cortlandt Manor, N.Y.

Hours of Operation:

THE TOLL HOUSE is located on Bear Mt. Road, Cortlandt Manor, NY and was dedicated on September 22, 2002. It is a visitor center with information about the Hudson Valley. It is opened seasonally from May to November.


