MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

Supervisor Puglisi called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

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PLEDGE TO THE FLAG

Supervisor Puglisi led all in attendance in a Pledge to the Flag.

SUPERVISOR'S PROCLAMATIONS AND REPORTS

<u>Supervisor Puglisi</u> spoke of the 225th Celebration at George's Island which turned out to be a terrific day, despite the rain. Many people attended the event. There was a mini parade, historical costumes, bands, athletes from the Town teams and very brief speeches. It is being broadcast on Channel 78 and can be streamed on your computers. The fireworks will now be at the annual Cortlandt Family Fun Day on Memorial Drive on Sept. 7th about 7:45 p.m. The rain date will be Sunday, Sept. 8th.

Also coming up is the Town's Annual Charitable Golf Outing at the Hollowbrook Golf Course put on by the Recreation Department with John Palmiotto and Ken Sherman. This is to benefit our First Responders. To register, residents should call the Recreation Department. This ends with a dinner at the Hollowbrook Golf Course dining hall.

On October 26 there will be the first ever 5K Run and participants can also register at the Recreation Department. It will be held at the Cortlandt Waterfront Park and will be for all age groups.

SUPERVISOR'S REPORTS, (cont.)

Supervisor Puglisi spoke of the Lafayette Avenue/ Conklin Avenue exit from the hospital project which will be just about completed in one week stating "this will make a safer access out of the hospital and out of Lafayette Avenue which was the goal for this project"

The Town will be co-hosting the 9/11 Annual Ceremony with the Villages of Croton-on-Hudson and Village of Buchanan on Sept. 11th, at 3:00 p.m. at the Memorial Park and new monument at Croton Park. The **Supervisor** invited residents to attend the ceremony.

On a roll call attendance taken by Town Clerk Dyckman all Town Board members indicated their presence.

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TOWN BOARD REPORTS

<u>Councilmember Farrell:</u> Commented that the 225th Birthday Celebration was marred by late afternoon rain, but he wanted to underline how impressed he was by the Town staff and the way they coordinated and pulled the event together. Many entities and departments were involved, neighbors notified, decorations to put up, stage set-ups, etc. Councilmember Farrell stated that the coordination, the effort and the results were very impressive.

A group has been formed called the <u>Cortlandt Community Rowing Association</u>. This is a group incorporated consisting of 6 or more members of the community interested in bringing the sport of rowing to Cortlandt at the Cortlandt Waterfront Park. They are trying to coordinate a "learn to row" event to take place on Sept. 7th. This is being planned with the North Rockland Rowing Club who has a very successful program. They will set up and the public can see and try out the boats to find out what this sport is about. More information will follow. Councilmember Farrell thanked the Board for their support in this endeavor.

<u>Councilmember Lindau-Martin:</u> Echoed Councilmember Farrell's complements to the staff for putting together the 225th Celebration and to the Supervisor for securing funding for the event. She announced that the Annual Croton Rotary Antique Car Show will be taking place on September 29th.

Councilmember Becker: Spoke of the successful CHOP program and that they now have about 2000 residents involved as well as 12 participating oil companies. Current members do not need to do anything as their membership remains active. For those who would like to join, it is \$5 fee to the Town and participants are free to use any one of the oil companies at any time. Each company guarantees their best price and a

few hundred dollars are saved by the homeowner. Councilmember Becker encouraged the residents to use the program and give it a try.

<u>Councilmember Sloan:</u> Spoke of the Rt. 202 project being completed soon and that Rt. 202 will probably get the most of the green lights and will be coordinated with the light on Conklin Avenue. They look forward to the better flow of traffic in a few weeks.
