Purpose

It is the desire of the Town Board to have information about Town operations, programs, etc. to be available to the public in an accessible format as possible.

With the onset of Facebook it is now possible for a Town "Place Page" with a "Wall" to be established wherein residents who are members of Facebook can indicate their desire to have any updates on the Town Wall forwarded to them automatically so they are fully aware of updates or changes to the information provided.

It is with the intent to make Government as open as possible if the Town Board adopts this policy.

- The Supervisor and/or her designee are authorized to establish a Town account with Facebook to establish a Town of Cortlandt Government "Place Page" with a "Wall only".
- Two (2) authorized users will be designated by the Supervisor who will be responsible for updating the information on the Wall and fulfilling all requirements to keep the information current and as up to date as possible.
- The Wall shall be used to post messages with respect to items of interest to the residents of the Town and it will mirror the latest news section of the Cortlandt website.
- Only the Town can post information on this Wall. No outside comments or messages will be accepted or received. Facebook users will merely indicate their like of the wall in order for it to be connected into their Facebook system.
- The Town Supervisor shall take any and all steps necessary to implement this policy.

- Croton Enterprise, LLC vs. Town of Cortlandt known as Section: 79.17, Block: 2, Lot: 2 shall be resolved by the following: adjusting the assessment rolls for 2006, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011, each year being reduced by a value of \$34,735.00 of assessed value.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all officials of the Town are responsible for implementing said Order once same is entered by the Supreme Court of Westchester County.
