STORM PREPAREDNESS CHECKLIST

☐ Pay close attention to weather advisories and storm warnings



☐ Keep a flashlight and fresh batteries handy



☐ Refuel vehicles and ensure they are in good working condition



☐ Have a battery powered radio to keep informed of restoration efforts



☐ Have a plan to check on vulnerable neighbors and family members



☐ Stock water and packaged or canned foods that do not require refrigeration



☐ Have a phone that does not require an electric outlet to operate; Charge cell phones or have a car cell phone charger



☐ Ensure adequate supplies of medications, cash, and other necessities





- Stay at least 30 feet away from downed power lines, and lines that may be entangled and hidden in fallen trees. Assume a downed line is live.
- Avoid using candles for illumination.
- Never use outdoor gas or charcoal grills, indoors as they pose a fire hazard and, over time, can give off deadly carbon monoxide gas. Use these appliances outdoors only, with proper ventilation. Operate motor vehicles outdoors only, and never in the garage.

What's New with Water-What You Need to Know

Early next year, The Town of Cortlandt will be contacting you to make an appointment to visit your homes, to take care of two items simultaneously.

First, the EPA is requiring all communities to test for copper and lead. This must be done within the calendar year 2024 and it requires a visit to each and every home. Obviously, this is a good thing as it is important that all residents know whether or not they need to worry about these substances in their water.





Secondly, every home has a water meter that is used to determine the amount consumed. The initial meters were installed in the 2004 timeframe, and now that they are approaching 20 years old the batteries are rapidly failing. It is therefore necessary to replace these meters during the upcoming year and it seems best to perform both the water quality testing and meter replacements at the same time, necessitating only one home visit. There is nothing to do now. This is just a heads up for plans for 2024.

Finally, billing through The Northern Westchester Joint Waterworks (NWJWW) is being updated, for better accuracy and simplicity. Accordingly, the billing cycles for you and your neighbors will be adjusted so that everyone in your area is on the same cycle. Some will receive their bill on time, but others will see a pause or delay in when their bill is delivered. Any adjustments for the delayed billing cycle will be made on the subsequent bill, and all subsequent bills will be on this new cycle.

HOW TO CREATE A FAMILY ACCOUNT:

- 3. On the next page complete the "Account Creation" fields and click on Create at the bottom of the page.
- 4. On the next page you will see the Community Pass Privacy Statement. After reading, click 'Accept'. Then click 'Finish'.
- 5. Please save your login and password for future use.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR PROGRAMS:

- 2. Log in using the permanent username and password for your account.

- Individual checks are necessary for separate courses and camp programs.
- There is a point when a program must be canceled or modified if there is insufficient registration. All programs require a high level of coordination often including facility scheduling, staffing, volunteer recruitment and purchasing of supplies. Please register early!
- It is recommended that your registration be completed a minimum of two (2) weeks prior to the start of the program.
- If space is available in any program one week prior to the start of the program, nonresidents will be allowed to participate by paying a 20% surcharge of the higher fee.

 - From the Town of Cortlandt Community Pass login homepage click on the "Create an Account" tab.
 - On the next page complete the "Account Creation" fields and click on Create at the bottom of the page.
 - On the next page you will see the Community Pass Privacy Statement, After reading, click 'Accept'.
 - Then click 'Finish'. Please save your login and password for future use.
- 2. Each adult resident in the household requesting an ID Card must submit two forms of proof of residency (Drivers license, current utility bill, current paystub, check with Town of Cortlandt address, car registration, etc. Previously issued ID cards are NOT acceptable as current proof of residency), via email to recidcard@townofcortlandt.com, along with the following.
 - Residents must also specify which family members in their account would like an ID Card
 - Residents must also submit photos of each family member requesting an ID Card
 - In color
 - Taken within the past 6 months, showing current appearance
 - Use a clear image of your face. Do not use filters commonly used on social media.
 - Full face, front view with a plain background
 - Have someone else take your photo. No selfies.
 - Do not wear a hat or headgear
 - Do not wear sunglasses
- 3. Office staff will then register each family member for their ID Cards.
- 4. Residents will be notified when their ID Cards are registered through Community Pass. Families will not be eligible to register for any other program until the balance for their ID Cards is paid in full.
- 5. Finally, office staff will print the physical ID Cards, and mail them to the address on the residents Community Pass account.

Residents may also get Town of Cortlandt Recreation Photo ID Cards in office at Town of Cortlandt Town Hall located at 1 Heady Street, Cortlandt Manor, Office #11; hours are Monday- Friday, 9:00 AM- 3:30 PM.

GENERAL TOWN OF CORTLANDT RECREATION DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

CREDITS/ REFUNDS

- A full refund will be issued for any program cancelled by the Recreation Department.
- Any refund request because of illness or accident must be submitted in writing and be accompanied by a doctor's note. Refunds will be prorated based on the date received. Requests must be made prior to the end of the program and will not be considered when a program is half over. All requests must be submitted in writing.
- All other refund/credit requests (other than medical) must also be submitted in writing and will be assessed a \$15.00 processing fee and issued a prorated program credit based on the date received. The credit must be used within two years from the date and must be mailed in with your application to ensure proper credit towards your next program or league registration. The credit is not replaceable - original form must be submitted for credit.
- Whether the initial registration is paid via cash, check, or credit card, all refunds will be issued via check.

SLIDING FEE SCALE AVAILABLE

It is the intention of the Town that no resident of the Town be denied the ability to participate in programs because of an inability to pay. Income Tax backup is necessary, unemployment information, and any other paper work is requested for financial help already received by any other agencies. The fee reduction can be used with any program registration, sports league or resident pass in the Recreation Division. The society was founded in 1921 and has been headquartered in the historic Little Red Schoolhouse, 297 Locust Avenue, Cortlandt Manor, since 1972. A primary goal is hands-on education of children about life in the mid-19th century through such activities as the Early School Days program and the annual Colonial Fair, led by history enthusiasts in period clothing. Other activities include reenactments of local military events from the Revolutionary War, erection of roadside markers at local historic sites, annual memorial services, upgrading of Van Cortlandtville Memorial Park and rehabilitation of the Van Cortlandt family plot in Hillside Cemetery.

The society welcomes appropriate memorabilia and genealogical records from local residents. The Jane E. Lytle Arboretum in Croton-on-Hudson NY provides a variety of walking trails, including a handicap-accessible trail, through wildlife habitats on 22 acres of woods and wetlands. Located at the end of Lounsbury/ Fox Road and following a short drive or walk across the Hudson National golf course, the Arboretum is open seven days a week, 365 days a year.

FURNACE DOCK LAKE

The Town of Cortlandt acquired and saved the 100 year old Furnace Dock Lake in 2011.

Rules and Regulations

- All activities at your own risk
- Park is open dawn to dusk

Dog Park Rules and Regulations PARTICIPATION AGREEMENT AND ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND LIABILTY INSURANCE

- Dog Park closes at dusk daily.
- No animals other than dogs may be brought into the fenced area.
- All dogs must be leashed until safely inside the dog park and returned to a leash prior to exiting. Make sure gates are closed after entering and leaving the park.
- Do not leave a leash on a dog in the park. Bring your leash into the park in case of emergency or altercation.
- Dog owners must remain in the fenced area while their dogs are using the dog park. Owners must be in view of their dogs and have voice control at all times.
- Children accompanying dog owners must be strictly supervised and at least twelve years old to be allowed inside unless accompanied by an adult.
- 7. Children under ten years old not allowed (some dogs see small dogs as prey) in large dog area.
- Children under five years old not allowed in the park.
- Spectators should remain outside the fenced area.
- 10 Aggressive dogs and dogs in heat are not allowed.
- Owners must immediately leash and remove dogs from the dog park at the first sight of aggressive behavior.
- Do not bring sick dogs to the park.
- Owners must dispose of waste properly in the designated on-site containers.
- Owners must prevent dogs from digging holes.
- While small bite-sized training treats are permitted, food in bowls, long lasting chews, or glass containers are not allowed.
- No Smoking and no food are allowed inside of the dog park.
- No more than three dogs per person are allowed on any single visit.
- Puppies less than four months old are not permitted in the park. 18.
- 19. Dogs must be licensed and vaccinated for rabies and DHLPP. Current license and rabies tags must be worn on the dog's collar at all times.
- Owners are liable for any injury or damage caused by their dog and are fully responsible for their dog's actions.
- Trainers are not allowed to use the park to conduct business.
- Any incident, problem etc. should be reported to the Cortlandt Recreation Department at 914-734-1050.
- In the event of an emergency, call 911.

Located at the Cortlandt Waterfront Park (Off Riverview Avenue and Broadway in the Hamlet of Verplanck)

Seasonal Use ONLY from April 1st through October 31st, Park Hours 7:00 AM to Dusk

Rules and Regulations

- Town of Cortlandt, Village of Buchanan and Village of Croton residents only
- Use of the ramp for commercial purpose is strictly prohibited
- Town of Cortlandt Boat Launch Permit is required.
- Permit is available at the Cortlandt Town Hall in the Town Clerk's office at 1 Heady Street, Cortlandt

HOLLOW BROOK TRAIL

Hollow Brook Trail was dedicated on October 20, 2016 the trail is part of 70 acres that was given to the Town several years ago. The trail was completed in August and is approximately 3 quarters of a mile long. The entrance to the trail is located at the bottom of Anton Place, in Lake Peekskill, Town of Cortlandt. The trail is adjacent to the Hollow Brook golf course.

HOLLOW BROOK GOLF COURSE

For Cortlandt Residents

Public Access to the Hollow Brook Golf Course (off Oregon Road)

The Hollow Brook Golf Club is a private/ public course with Town residents being able to reserve tee-times. The Town coordinates those rounds reserved for the exclusive use of Town residents (agreement on file), Tuesday through Sunday for public use. On Tuesday and Thursday, seven of the tee times are discounted at \$85.00 after 2:00 PM, Greens fees will be a total \$110.00 for all other tee times Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. On Fridays, Saturdays, Sundays and Holidays greens fees will be \$160.00 with no tee times before noon. Prices include greens fees and a cart. Range balls (only available when playing) for \$10.00. Reservations can be made five days in advance by calling 914-734-1500.

Residents will need to purchase a golf sticker (\$12.00) in the Town of Cortlandt Recreation Department of Town Hall located at 1 Heady Street in Cortlandt Manor. This sticker will be placed on the back of your Town of Cortlandt Recreation Photo ID card. If you do not currently have a valid Town of Cortlandt Recreation Photo ID Card, one can be purchased for an additional \$7.00 by providing two forms of proof of residency. CHARLES J. COOK PARK

For over half a century, the Town of Cortlandt has owned the piece of property off Furnace Dock Road now known as the Charles J. Cook Recreation Center. After a 1.5 million dollar renovation in 2000, this recreational facility became one of Cortlandt's most popular venues. This active sports complex offers residents a variety of leisure activities. With a concrete surface, drainage system, filtration system, splash park and as of 2021, a newly upgraded bathhouse. The Charles J. Cook Pool is open daily during the summer from 10:45 AM until 7:00 PM and until 8:00 PM on Friday evenings. Swim areas are staffed with lifeguards, and on-site management.

A water spray park was dedicated in 2016 with five additional features. During June and July, the Town of Cortlandt Swim and Dive Teams hold meets and practice at the Pool.

The Town's summer camp program allows children, grades K-8th, to enjoy the pool as well as the Charles J. Cook Recreation Center's playground, all purpose ball field, two tennis courts, basketball courts, a fitness trail, and 9-hole miniature golf course.





The nature and fitness trail is approximately ½ mile and consists of an 8-ft wide rustic trail (natural) and twenty (20) pieces of fitness equipment. The miniature golf course opened in the spring of 2019; Each hole has a Town of Cortlandt inspired feature, such as the Little Red School House, Bear Mountain Bridge, and the Toll House. The course is open to both pool users and the general public during normal operating hours. The golf course will remain open spring, fall, summer, weather permitting.





For residents interested in exploring the natural environment, there are nature trails, the "Touch & Smell" Garden and the Bicentennial Garden. As a tribute to the 200th birthday of the Town of Cortlandt, the Bicentennial Garden includes a beautiful flower garden and a time capsule, containing over 100 items of importance in the Town's history.

HUDSON HIGHLANDS GATEWAY PARK

Sprout Brook Road (Main), Doris Lee Drive, Cortlandt Manor

Threatened twice by dense residential development, was protected in 1998 when a coalition of more than 35 groups representing homeowners, the homeowners, the community, government agencies and several environmental organizations united to preserve this 352-acre site. The Coalition to Preserve the Hudson Highlands Gateway raised \$6 million to buy the parcel. In May 2000, the Scenic Hudson Land Trust, the Town of Cortlandt and Westchester County purchased the property.

A network of trails in the park exposes visitors to woodlands, streams, steep slopes, bedrock outcroppings and meadows, revealing much human and natural history and providing spectacular river views. This park is ecologically significant because it is home to several; noteworthy ecosystems. The site's upland wetlands are crucial for many frogs and salamanders to survive. Several different snake species use the prominent, east-facing cliffs of the park to warm themselves in the sun. Also the park's Westchester County location is in one of the country's three

major bird migration corridors. Come spring, hundreds of thousands of birds fly over the park where they stop to rest and feed.

Since the property was acquired, the Hudson Highlands Gateway Task Force, a group of concerned citizens - has been working with The Scenic Hudson Land Trust, the Town of Cortlandt and New York-New Jersey Trail Conference on issues including park improvements, illegal ATV use and assessing the park's natural resources.

Hudson Highlands Gateway Park is an ideal destination for an afternoon or all-day outing. Recreational activities abound, including hiking, birding, crosscountry skiing, fishing and snowshoeing. Located at the southern end of the fabled Hudson Highlands, the park once served as a Revolutionary War lookout and now is open for public enjoyment.

Directions

Two parking areas are available; one is temporarily shared with Sprout Brook Park, 0.3 miles from the intersection of Sprout Brook Road and Highland Avenue, just past and on the same side as the athletic. Cross road and enter park through the gap in guardrail. Universally accessible parking area is at the end of Doris Lee Drive. Park on gravel in front offence.

Operating Hours

Open year-round, from dawn to dusk.

Rules & Regulations:

- · The park is open dawn to dusk.
- Vehicles are permitted only in the designated parking areas.
- Stay within the posted property boundaries, and be considerate of other visitors and adjoining property owners.
- Keep pets leashed; please clean up after them.
- Do not remove or destroy plants, wildlife or artifacts.
- Always hike with a friend.

The following are prohibited

Motorized vehicles, camping, fires, alcohol, firearms, feeding wildlife, smoking, dumping, swimming, metal detectors, mountain bikes and radios.

Deer ticks, which can transmit Lyme disease, are a growing problem. Take precautions and check for ticks after leaving.





Hudson Highlands Gateway Park has four trails, totaling more than 4.9 miles that traverse the 352-acre site. There are many meandering, wooded roads where one could easily get lost. Please stay on marked trails. The degree of difficulty for the hiking trails ranges from easy to moderate. Trail users should wear sturdy shoes and beware of loose rocks, holes and slippery surfaces.

(Red Trail)

Annsville Creek Trail 1 mile, approx. 1 hr.

This trail starts at Doris Lee Drive and is universally accessible to the Pond Overlook. It travels by Annsville Creek, which contains breeding trout populations. Fishing is allowed. A sensitive wetland area surrounds the creek.

(Blue Trail) **Upland Trail 2 miles**

A steep ascent through a meadow and mixed woods forest brings visitors to a terrific view of the Hudson River. The remainder of the trail encompasses rolling terrain that passes by many historic stonewalls.

(Yellow Trail)

Hudson Overlook Spur 0.6 miles

Distinguished by its scenic overlook, this trail also crosses a small stream that is the outlet for a large wetland upslope.

(White Trail)


Vernal Pool Trail 1.6 miles

Beginning from the northernmost point of the Upland Trail, this trail works its way up and along a ridgeline. As it descends it passes by a large vernal pool, through a wetland and contains a number of steep slopes. Be cautions of wet surfaces. The trail finishes along an old woods road and rejoins the Upland Trail.

LAKE MEAHAGH PARK

Westchester Avenue, Verplanck

Lake Meahagh Park hosts a basketball court, walking path, and is the home of the Town of Cortlandt Community Garden. It is also a boat launch for the **CCRA** (Cortlandt Community Rowing Association).



OSCAWANA BOAT LAUNCH

Oscawana boat launch is located on Cortlandt Street in Crugers. A launching area for kayak's and canoes; hiking trails that lead out to the Hudson River. It was dedicated on October 4, 2004 by former Cortlandt Town Supervisor Linda D. Puglisi and the Town Board.





SPROUT BROOK PARK

130 Sprout Brook Road in Cortlandt Manor The park is over 22 acres and has two softball fields, a little league field (which includes a snack bar and bating cage), soccer field, an all purpose field, a pavilion available for renting, a playground, and a dog park.

PICKLEBALL COURTS

With the increasing popularity of the growing paddle sport, Pickleball, the Town of Cortlandt has converted one tennis court at the Croton Community Recreation Area off of Croton Avenue (Down the road from Walter



Panas High School) into four pickleball courts.

The Cortlandt Hockey Rink located next to the Cortlandt Youth Center (3 Memorial Drive, Croton on Hudson) has also been converted into five Pickleball Courts. The rink will be used for Pickleball until mid November, when it will be turned



into the Cortlandt Ice Rink until the beginning of March.

THE TOLL HOUSE

Located on Bear Mt. Road, Cortlandt Manor, NY

Toll House was dedicated on September 22, 2002 and is a visitor center with information about the Hudson Valley. It is opened seasonally from May to November.


